

Obedience Class Rules

1. Please be prompt, we suggest arriving for the class 10 minutes prior to adjust your dog to his/her surroundings.
2. Have your dog under control and on a leash at all times when on the premises.
3. Only individuals training the dog may be on the training floor during class.
Keep dogs not enrolled in class at home.
4. Please wear shoes with rubber soles and without heels to ensure proper safety and footing in class.
5. Please do not bring a sick dog to class.
6. **ALL DOGS ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE CURRENT RABIES, DISTEMPER/PARVO AND BORDETELLA SHOTS, If old enough.**
A record from your vet must be brought to the first class. Dogs will not be permitted in class without written record of vaccinations.
7. **YOU ARE EXPECTED AT CLASS EACH WEEK., EVEN IF YOUR DOG CANNOT MAKE IT.**
Just as much can be learned by observing. Remember that these classes are for training you, not just the dog.
8. Please clean up after your dog. There will be scoops available for you. We suggest that you feed your dog after class. Have the dog eliminate before class to avoid accidents and upset stomachs due to excitement.
9. Everyone is required to have proper equipment. A nylon training collar can be properly fitted by the instructor. You can choose to purchase what you need from us the day of the class. You will be required to have the following:
 - A. **A properly fitting (snug) nylon or leather flat collar, bring any training collar you have to see if you can use it. There will be collars available for purchase at Camp KCS Store.**
 - B. **6 ft. leather leash - if you do not have one, one may be purchased at Camp KCS Store.**
10. We reserve the right to refuse or excuse any student and dog to whom we feel would be a liability to other students or their dogs. No extremely aggressive dogs.
11. There can be no refunds for people who drop out of class or who do not comply with our rules. Children are not permitted on the training floor. Visiting children must be accompanied and supervised by an adult.
12. In the case of severe weather, please call 570-234-4219 or check your e-mail if you are in doubt about the class being held.
13. Bring soft, small, easily eaten treats, such as chicken, cheese or soft dog treats. Something very special that the dog really likes. A quart size ziploc full would be good. Dogs favorite toy. Something small enough to fit into apron pocket.
